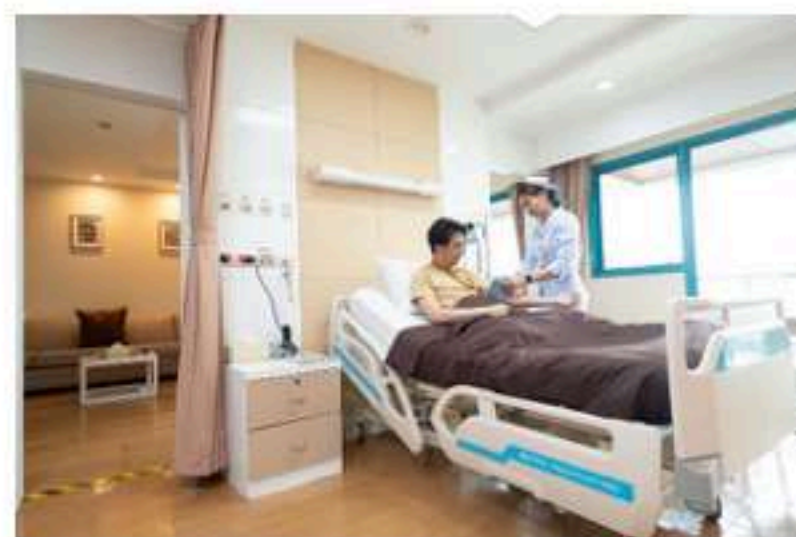

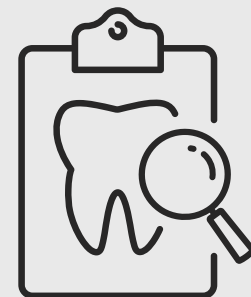

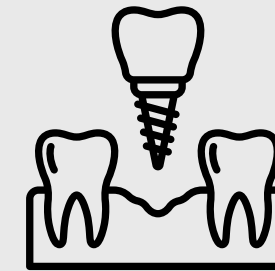

Importance of Oral Health in the Elderly

Most Common Dental Diseases in Elderly:

Ref: WHO Global Health Observatory Data (2025)

1. **Dental Caries** (Tooth Decay)
2. **Severe Gum Disease** (Periodontal Disease) - estimated to affect 1 billion people worldwide.
3. **Tooth Loss** - Direct consequence of untreated caries and severe gum disease.
4. **Oral Cancers** - About 380,000 new cases diagnosed yearly, with higher risk in elderly populations.



GUM DISEASE PREVENTION

Early Signs to Watch:

- Bleeding when flossing or brushing
- Red, swollen, or tender gums
- Persistent bad breath
- Gums pulling away from teeth
- Loose or shifting teeth

GUM DISEASE PREVENTION

Prevention Strategies:

- Good Oral Hygiene : Brush twice daily with soft bristles
- Floss daily (water flossers work too!)
- Mouthwash
- Regular professional cleanings
- Clean More Often If You Have Risk Factors

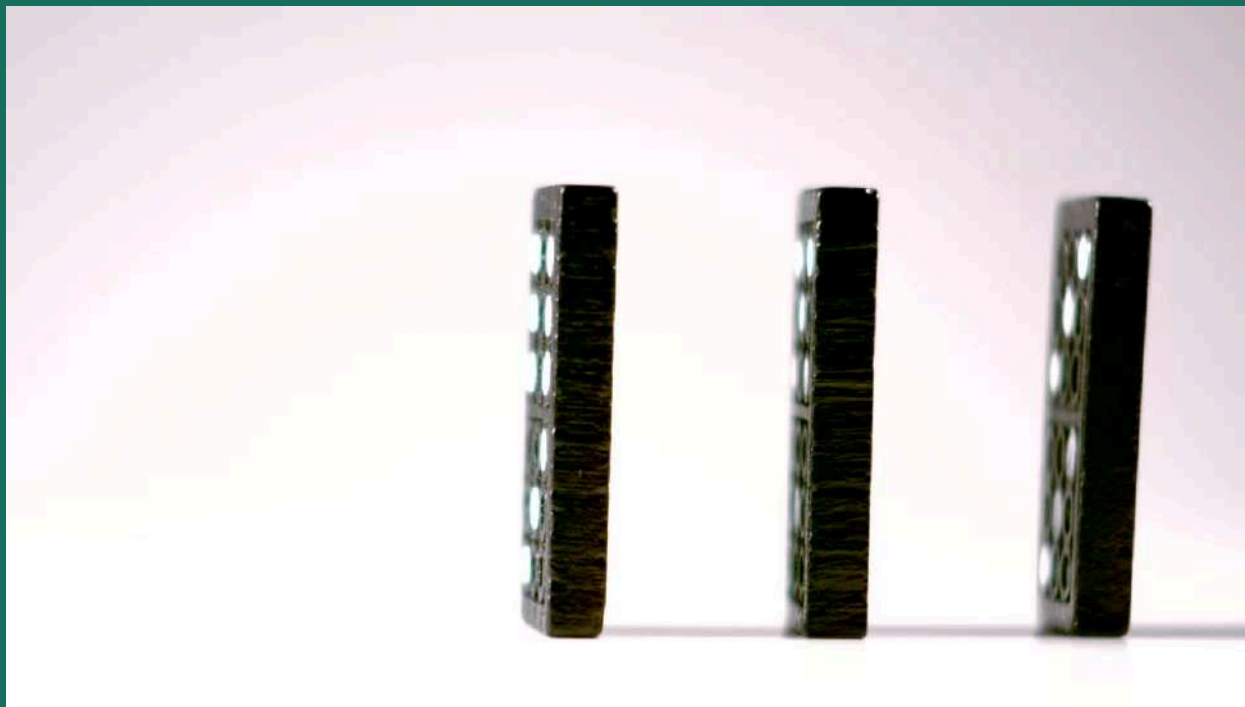

The Domino Effect of Losing Just ONE Tooth



Immediate Effects (Within weeks):

- Adjacent teeth begin to shift toward the gap
- Opposing tooth starts to over-erupt
- Bite balance is disrupted
- Food gets trapped more easily


Short-term Effects (3-6 months):

- Increased pressure on remaining teeth
- Difficulty chewing on that side
- Speech changes become noticeable
- Bone loss begins in the empty socket

Long-term Effects (1+ years):

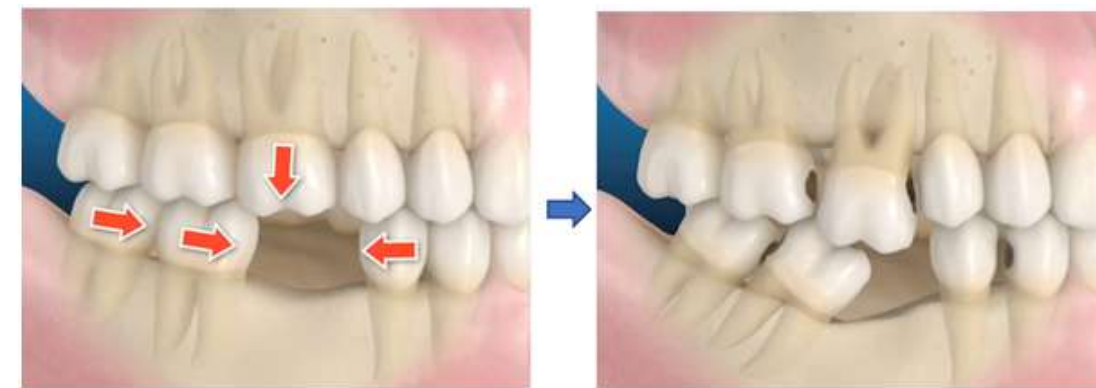
- Chain reaction of tooth movement
- More teeth become loose and at risk
- Significant bone loss in jaw
- Facial collapse becomes visible

The Consequences of Missing Teeth

Tooth Loss =  Quality of Life

Losing just ONE back tooth increases your risk of losing MORE teeth by 30% within 5 years. Your mouth is a connected system

- when one part fails, others follow."

Removable Denture

- Affordable option
- Removable for cleaning
- Easy maintenance

Dental crown and Bridge

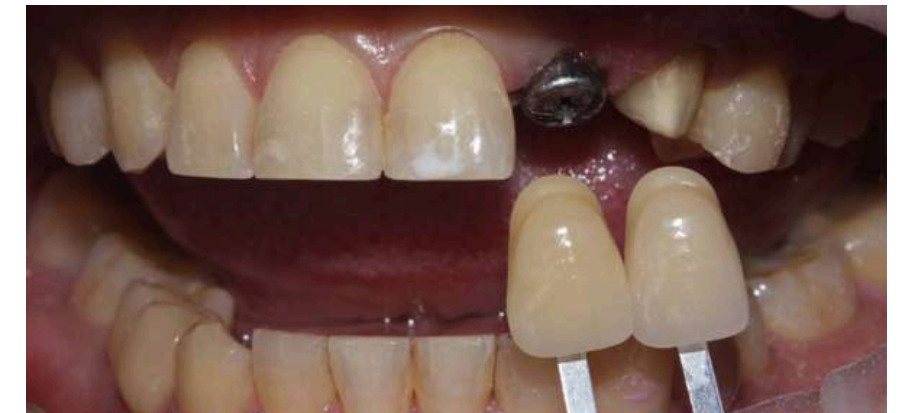
- Cannot be removed
- Looks like natural teeth
- Lifespan 5-10 years



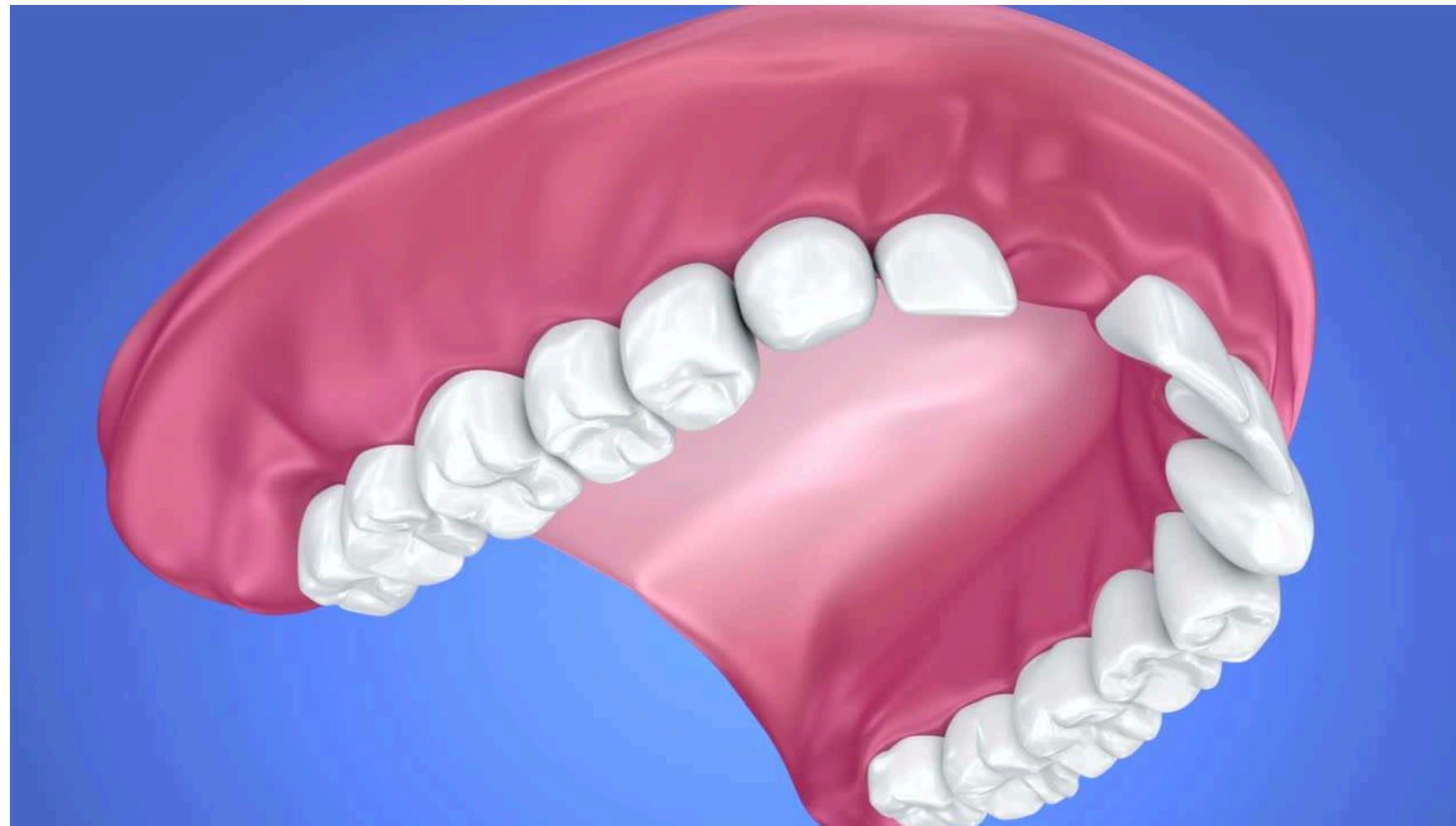

Dental Implant

- Strongest and most durable
- a long-lasting solution for missing teeth
- Prevents bone loss



Removable Dentures



Traditional & Modern Solutions

- **Complete Dentures** : Replace all teeth in upper or lower jaw. Held in place by suction and adhesive.
- **Partial Dentures** : Replace several missing teeth. Attach to remaining natural teeth with clasps.
- **Flexible Dentures** : Made from flexible materials for improved comfort and aesthetics.

Removable Dentures



Dental Crowns and Bridges

Dental Crowns:

- Restore severely damaged teeth
- Protect weak teeth from fracture
- Improve appearance and function
- Last many years with proper care
- Made from durable materials



Dental Crowns and Bridges

Dental Bridges:

- Replace 1-3 missing teeth
- Fixed (non-removable) solution
- Anchored to adjacent natural teeth
- Restore chewing and speaking

DENTAL IMPLANTS

What Are Dental Implants?

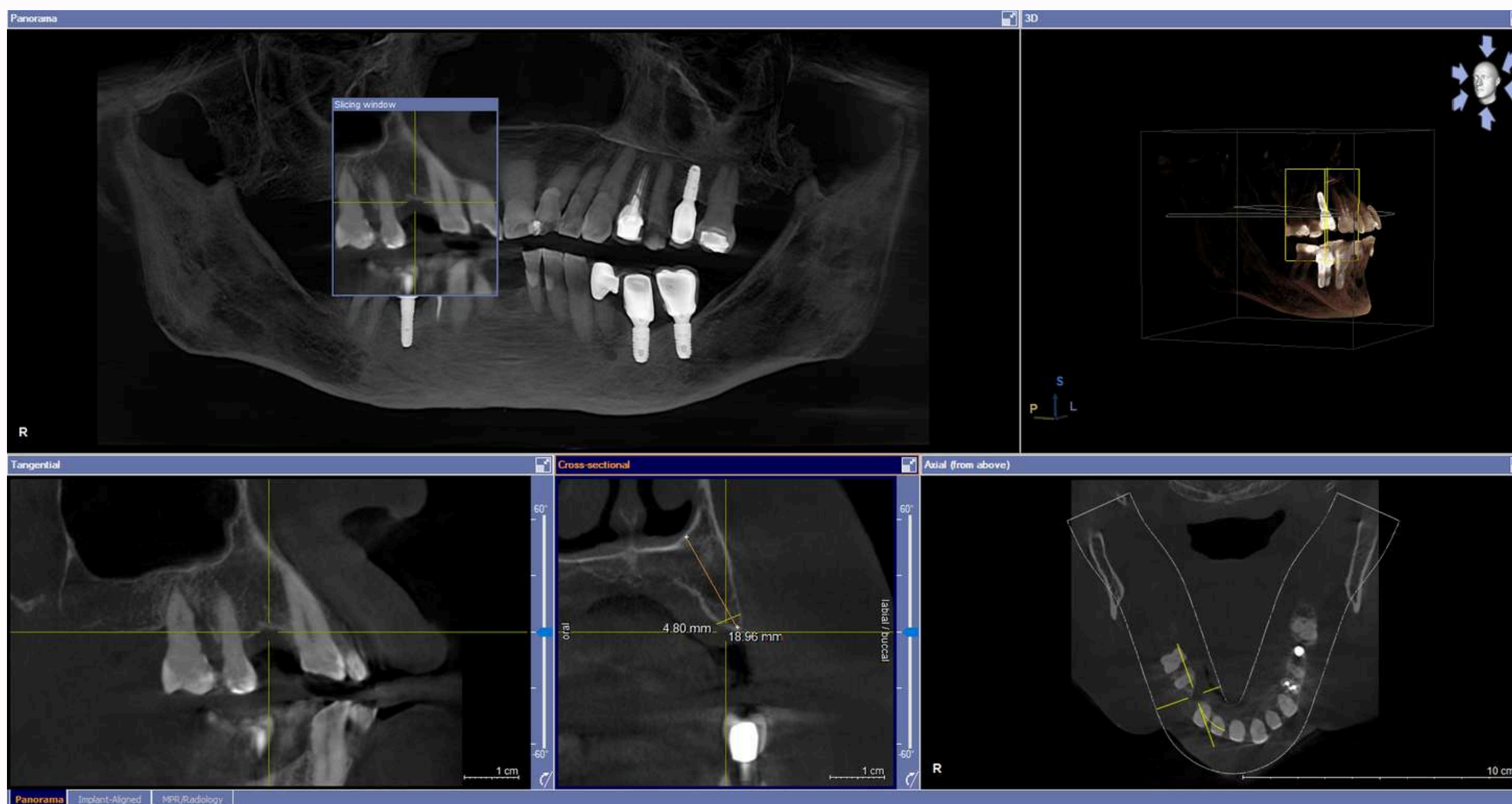
Dental implants are titanium posts surgically placed into the jawbone to replace tooth roots. They provide a stable foundation for crowns, bridges, or dentures.

The Process

- Consultation & Planning: 3D imaging and treatment planning
- Surgical Placement: Implant placed in jawbone
- Healing Period: 3-6 months for osseointegration
- Restoration: Crown, bridge, or denture attached
