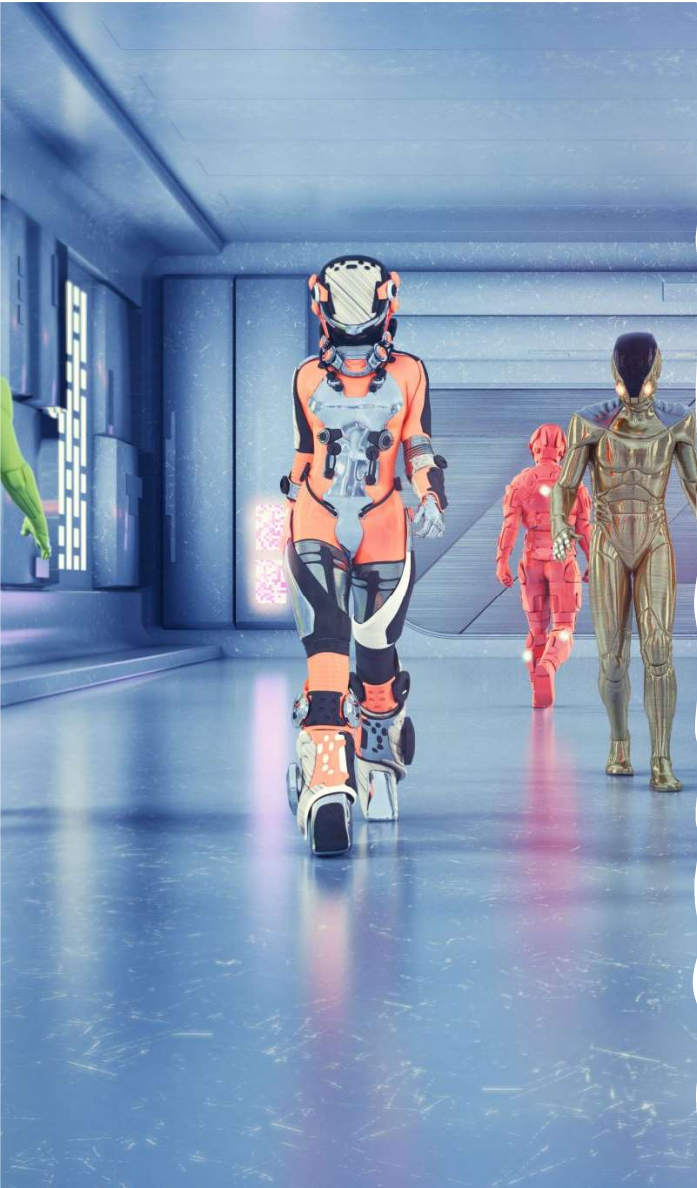
# Introduction to Novel Writing
